

Wild Bank Primary School Sports Premium Plan 2023/24

Objectives:

To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools against 5 key indicators:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
2. The profile of P.E and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. Increased participation in competitive sport

Our Vision for PE:

For all children participate in a high-quality physical education curriculum that inspires all pupils to succeed and excel in competitive sport and other physically demanding activities. We provide opportunities for pupils to become physically confident in a way which supports their health and fitness. Children will have the opportunity to compete in sport and other activities to build character and help to embed values such as fairness and respect.

During the school year of 2023-2024, the school will receive £17450 to improve the quality of sport and PE provision at Wild Bank Primary School.
