

# Key Stage 2 Data 2025



## Attainment

The table below shows the percentage of children in **Year 6** achieving the expected standard in 2025. The number of pupils in the cohort was **14**.

The reading, writing and mathematics combined measure consisted of children achieving the 100+ scaled score in mathematics and reading and being assessed at the expected standard for writing.

To achieve the expected standard, children needed to reach a scaled score of 100 in the reading, mathematics and GPS tests and a scaled score of 110+ to achieve the greater depth standard.
